The *EpiWe project* (*Epigenetics for Women*) investigates how violence against women imprints lasting molecular "scars" on victims' DNA expression, profoundly affecting their health. Using advanced epigenetic analysis, *EpiWe* aims to reveal how trauma-induced DNA modifications contribute to long-term health risks and it seeks to implement innovative precision medicine protocols. In this new multicenter phase, the project invites

women from five Italian regions to donate biological samples, enabling researchers to monitor these epigenetic changes over time.
